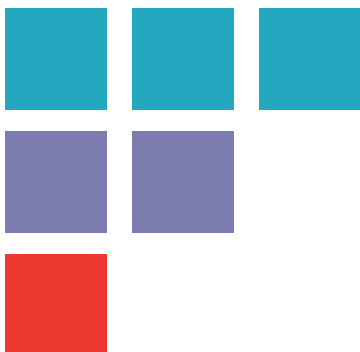

The programme specifically targets adolescents, prisoners and men who have sex with men in eastern and southern Africa.
