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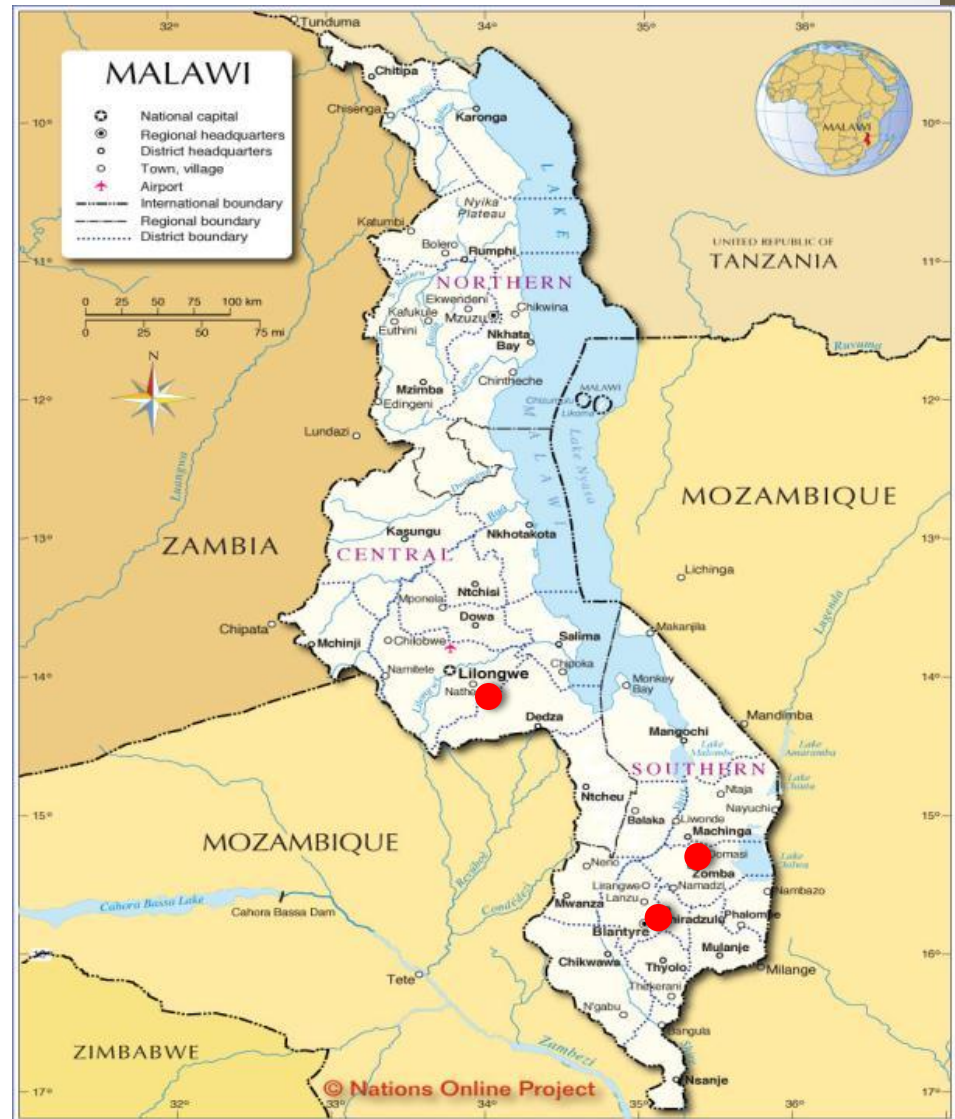

ENTRY

- **Comprehensive Screening**
 - Medical Assessment
 - HTC
 - TB
 - STI/Syphilis rapid test
 - Hep B Vaccination
 - Counselling

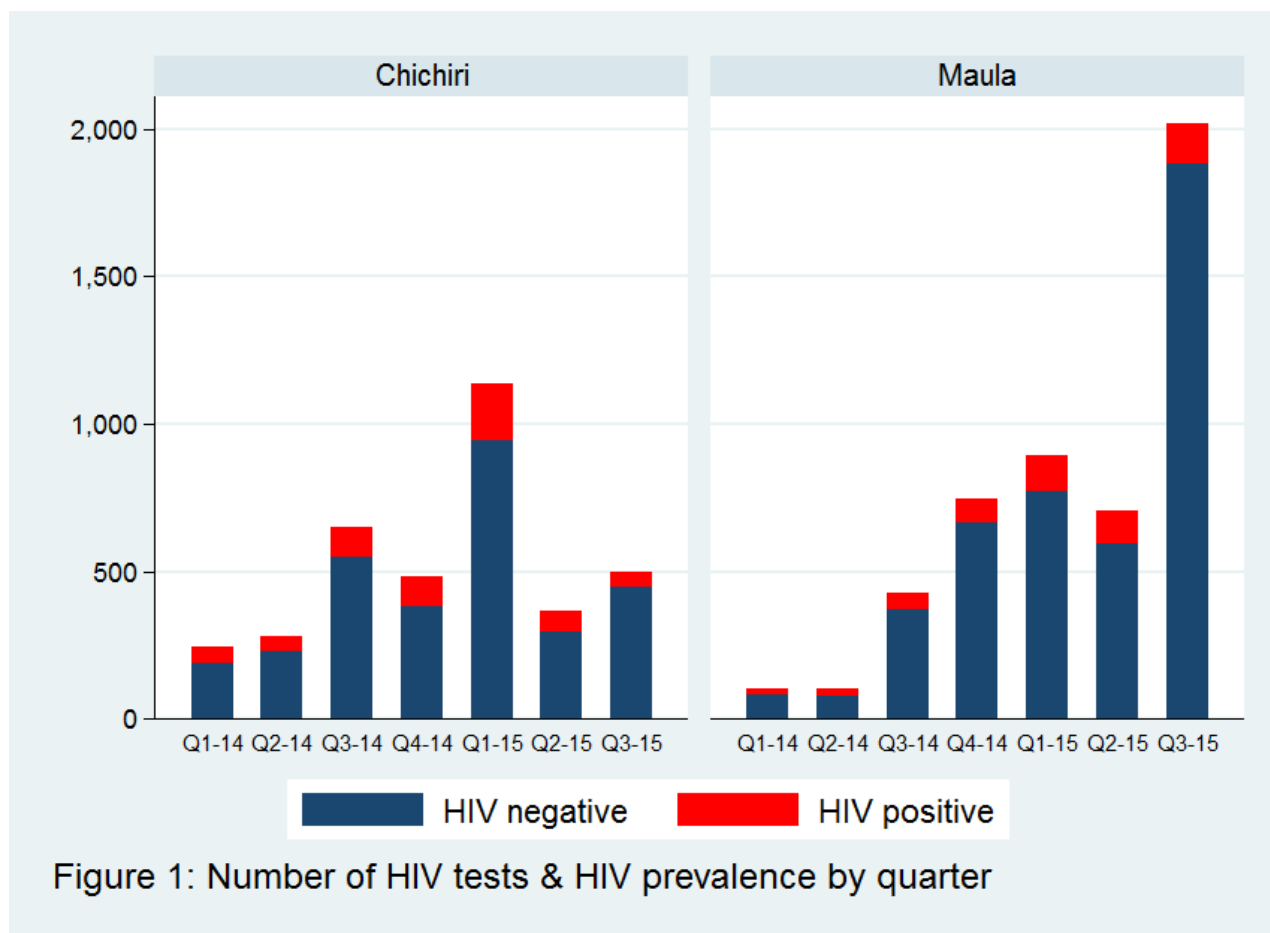
STAY

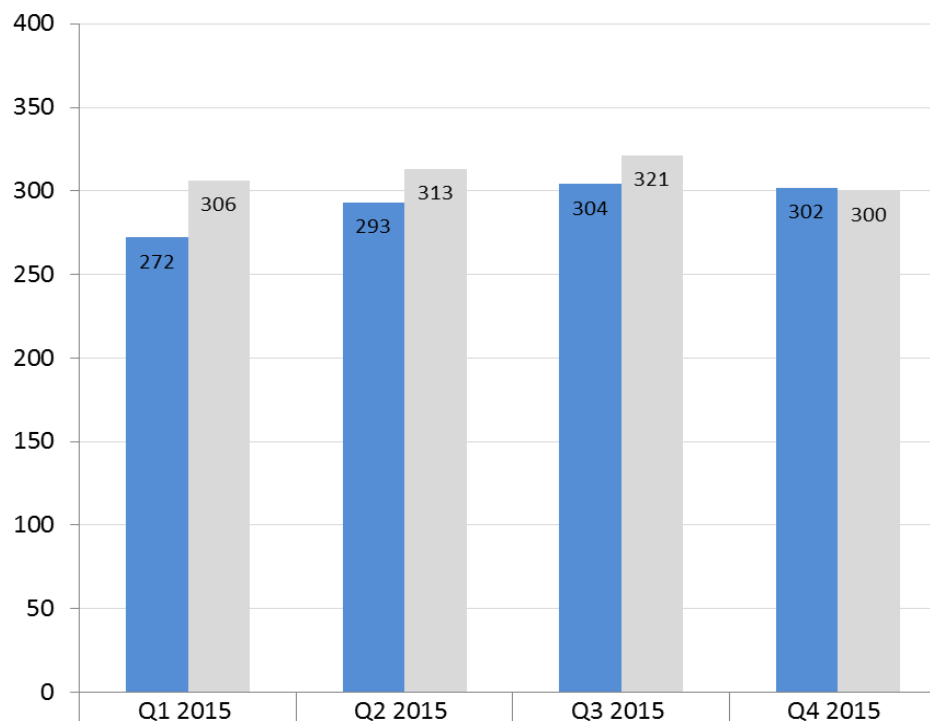


HIV positive alive on ART, Chichiri and Maula prisons, 2015

- General living conditions: Overcrowding, Food, water and sanitation
- Health staff = security staff
- Drug supply
- Condom use as prevention
- Re-testing
- Referral system for severe cases
- Nutrition
- Migrants
